

Butte Falls, Grants Pass Dumped By Beaver Sluggers

Brookings Beavers annexed two more non-league games during the past week, downing Grants Pass under the lights at Grants Pass 7 to 3 on July 9, and winning handily by a 10 to 3 score over Butte Falls, here on July 13.

Rusty Martindale had the Beavers handcuffed with one scratch hit for the first five innings at Grants Pass when he retired in favor of right-hander Driscoll.

Driscoll disposed of the first two Beavers to face him in the sixth but Frank Burdell then laced out a triple and five of his mates followed with successive singles good for four runs and enabling Brookings to take the lead 4 to 3.

The Beavers added three insurance runs in the seventh, highlighted by Jerry Mason's first home run of the season. Vic Lapiner scattered six Grants Pass hits and struck out nine.
