

Forestry Advisory Board Named In Pacific Northwest

PORTLAND—A Pacific Northwest Forest Service advisory council has been formed to meet periodically with the Regional Forester and Director, Pacific Northwest Forest and Range Experiment station. The first meeting was held here at the regional office, July 22.

Members of the council are: Col. W. B. Greeley of Suquamish, Wash.; Herman Oliver of John Day, Ore.; G. E. Cannon of Portland; John L. King of Seattle; Dave Doneen of Farmington, Wn.; Dr. A. L. Strand, Oregon State College, Corvallis; Edward Sammons of Portland; Jack Rogers

of Wenatchee, Wash.; Judge Robert W. Sawyer, of Bend, Ore.; Phillip Hitchcock of Klamath Falls; Ben Day of Gold Hill, Ore.; Stanley Jewett, of Portland; Stanley N. Earl of Portland and Werner Mayr of Aberdeen, Wash. Col. W. B. Greeley was selected by the council as its chairman.

Staggering tenure of charter membership was also decided upon at the initial meeting—four members to serve on the council for a two-year period, five members to serve for three years, and five members to serve for four years. Thereafter, tenure of membership for a full term will be four years.

In commenting on the formation of this new organization, Regional Forester J. Herbert Stone said: "The Forest Service desires the counsel of informed leading citizens of Washington and Oregon on some of our policies and programs and their application to na-

tional forest management and research. We believe that such counsel will be helpful in giving more effective and efficient public service."

The function of the advisory council shall be to consider broad questions of policy, program and procedure affecting the administration of Forest Service activities in the Pacific Northwest, and to give the Regional Forester and Experiment Station Director the benefit of its opinion. Responsibility for final decisions must remain with the Forest Service in accordance with existing laws and regulations. Members of the council are serving without pay and without re-imbursement for travel or expense.

Regular meetings will be held twice a year—one in May and one in November. Other meetings may be called by either the Regional Forester or Director to obtain the opinion of the council on matters of current importance, Stone added. "In addition to this new regional advisory council, we have individual national forest councils established on the Willamette, Whitman and Ochoco forests in Oregon, and one in the process of formation for portions of the Snoqualmie and Wenatchee forests in Washington. We plan to expand this program in the Pacific northwest so that more of our forest supervisors might have the benefit of local considered opinion in discharging their forest management responsibilities."
