### PMA Group Named For Northern Curry

LANGLOIS—A Northern Curry County PMA nominating committee, consisting of John Donaldson, Charles Fox, Paul Smith, Raymond Capps, and Ray Zumwalt, met at the home of John Donaldson, Wednesday and placed in nomination a group of farmers who will be candidates for office of precinct committeemen.

Farmers of this area will later vote by secret ballot on those to be selected by this committee and select a list of three regular and two alternate precinct committeemen, whose duty it will be to assist in carrying out this farm program for the year 1953.

More work will be centered on the precinct committeemen for 1953 because of the new change that will go into effect it will be necessary to visit every farm of the area and together with the farmer line out his most important soil conservation needs.

The purpose of the new program is to urge soil conservation and to encourage increased production to keep in pace with the increase of population. Training classes will later on be held for precinct committeemen to fit them for the task allotted them.

Other Langlois Notes  
Visitors are coming from all over Coos and Curry counties to view the century plant blooming on the Bill Jennings place on Floras Creek. This plant was set out in 1913 by McAdams and was cared for tenderly throughout the years by subsequent owners of the property. This is the first year it has bloomed and it sends a spike 26 feet into the air, covered with beautiful white bell-shaped flowers. This plant is rarely seen so far north, and gets its name from the fact that it is supposed to bloom once every 100 years.
