

Beaver Presented Pair Of Games To Medford, Sunday

Brookings' quest for a second league victory again went for naught on the local high school diamond Sunday as the Medford Cheney Studs edged the Beavers in both games, by 8 to 7 and 6 to 5 scores.

The Beavers tied up the first contest in a 3-run rally in the eighth only to have the Studs win it in the ninth as Catcher Frank

Roelandt lead off with a drive between left center and center that rolled across the road for a home run. While Brookings tagged veteran league pitcher, Paul Gehrman, for 16 hits, three Stud double plays ruined just that many scoring chances. Loose Beaver fielding also aided Medford in her scoring.

After trailing 3 to 0 in the 7-inning nightcap, the Beavers broke through on Stud Hurler Terry Maddox with two runs in the 4th and took a 5 to 2 lead with three more in the fifth. Medford edged closer with a single run in the sixth and then put across the tying and winning runs, both unearned in the top of the seventh.

With one down, Roelandt singled and continued to third as the ball got through the right fielder for an error. This apparently unnerved Jim Nierman and he promptly walked Jack Gordon who then immediately stole second on an attempted double steal. Snuffy Smith, next up, hit a ground ball to second, scoring Roelandt.

All hands were safe as Jacobson's throw to Johnson at third was too late to force Gordon.

Gordon scored the winning run on Maddox' out to center, and Smith was out stealing.

Bunky Peterson lead off with an infield hit in the Beavers' last chance to salvage the game, but Nierman hit into a double play and Wallace popped out to first.

Frank Roelandt was the hitting star of the game for the Studs, with six hits in eight times for the two games. Bill Wallace, han-

dling 13 fielding chances in first game, had 6 to 9 in the hit column, and Frank Burdell apparently increased his average as the league's leading hitter with four for eight. Burdell is currently hitting 433.

The Beavers travel to Roseburg for a two-game series this coming week-end and then play their last double-header at home against the league-leading Drain, Aug. 17.
