## Fair Princess Will Be Named, Sat'day

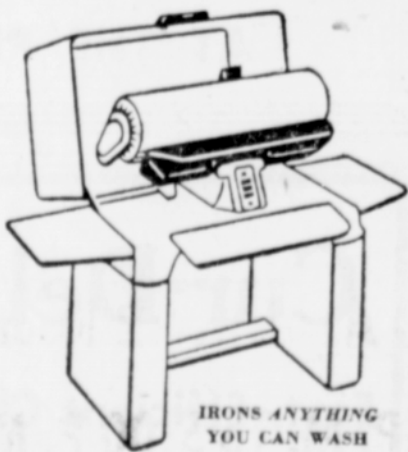

## Severance Pay Due Korean Veterans

GOLD BEACH — Veterans of service since the start of the Korean conflict may obtain forms on which to apply for mustering-out payments under the Veterans Re-adjustment Assistance act of 1952, C. E. Seger said, Monday.

The state veteran's department has re-produced a supply of the application blanks, which are now in the hands of all county service officers. The department will also furnish them to veterans on request.

Mustering-out pay is provided in the new "G I" bill for personnel discharged from active duty in the armed forces since June 27, 1950, whether they had received mustering-out pay for World War 2 service or not. Applications are now being accepted by the various branches of the armed forces.

The payments amount to \$100

for veterans with less than 60 days active service; \$200 for those with 60 days or more active service in the United States only; and \$300 for veterans with 60 days or more active service, some of which was outside the United States or in Alaska. Payments to discharged veterans will be in a lump sum. Those still on active duty will receive \$100 at discharge and the remainder, if any, in \$100 monthly installments.

It is paid to enlisted men and to officers below the grade of major or lieutenant commander. Discharge must have been under honorable conditions. In the event a veteran dies after discharge from service since June 27, 1950, and before receiving a portion or all of his mustering-out pay, his wife, children or parents may collect the payments.

Because the applicant must submit his original "report of separation" along with his application, he is urged by the Oregon Veterans department to record the document in his local court house before applying.

Applications can be had through C. E. Seger, the local county serv-

ice officer. Call in person or write to him.
