Barbecue, Lamb Show Features Of Curry County Fair

GOLD BEACH—A fat lamb and wool show with a free barbecue for everyone will be a feature of the Curry County fair to be held here, August 22, 23 and 24. This event will be sponsored by the Curry County Livestock Association, according to Rod McKenzie, president.

The free barbecue will be held at noon, starting at 11 a. m. on Saturday, August 23. Milt Moore of Gold Beach, chairman of the barbecue committee, reports that 20 yearling wethers have been donated by sheepmen members of the association and will assure everyone plenty of choice meat.

Wilson Freeman, of Brookings, serving on the barbecue committee with Mr. Moore, has lined up all of the other food requirements for the barbecue, including hot rolls, coffee, plenty of barbecue sauce and all the trimmings and anyone attending the fair on Aug. 23 will be guests of the livestock association at the free barbecue.

Sheepmen of Curry county are now picking out their best rams, ewes and lambs to exhibit in the various classes listed in the Curry County fair premium list, which include this year, classes for rams, ewes, ewe lambs, fat lambs, and pens of three fat lambs.

In addition to cash awards, the county fair board is offering trophies for championships on the

best ewe, best ram, the best single fat lamb, the best pen of three fat lambs and the best fleece in the wool show. Competition for these coveted trophies is expected to be keen among Curry county sheepmen.

Harry Lindgren and Jim Eling, livestock specialists of Oregon State College, will judge all of the sheep classes and R. A. Ward, manager of the Pacific Wool Growers Association, will place the ribbons on fleece entered in the wool show.

A ram grading demonstration will be another interesting feature of the lamb and wool show this year in which all rams entered in the show will be graded according to the Oregon State College score card. In the ram grading demonstration each ram entered will be graded on its merits and is one of the methods used in improving the quality of rams used within the state.

It is expected that there will be a number of rams at the county fair this year which will be for sale and the fat lambs will be sold to the highest bidder and offered an excellent opportunity for residents of Curry county to fill their lockers with choice lamb for win-

ter use, said Clifford Jenkins, secretary to the livestock association.

Funds Coming In

Although returns are not complete from the house-to-house solicitation of the Winchuck, Harbor and Brookings areas for the purpose of raising funds for the building of a permanent home for the Chetco Community Library, results so far are quite encouraging.
