

DRAIN WINS PLAY-OFF SERIES

The City of North Bend was host for the Southwestern Oregon baseball league play-off series over the Labor Day week-end.

The 4th place Bandon Millers drew the 2nd place Coos Bay-North Bend Lumberjacks for the 1st game on Sunday and emerged victorious with a 4-run outburst in the 12th to win 8 to 4. Veteran Ad Liska relieved Bailey Brem of Bandon in the 5th and pitched shut-out ball for 7 and two-thirds innings.

In the 2nd Sunday tilt the Drain Black Sox, pennant winners for the regular season, with Roy Helser on the mound, won over Medford's Cheney Studs by an 8 to 5 score. This game was highlighted by Harv Storey's greatly disputed 3-run homer. The big "rhubarb" over an interpretation of a ground rule as to whether Storey's swat was a two-bagger or a home run, lasted over half an hour.

The two Sunday losers, Medford and Coos Bay-North Bend, met in the first game Labor Day to decide 3rd and 4th with the Medford Studs edging the heavy hitting Jacks in a great game, 3 to 2.

The championship game was another 3 to 2 thriller as Gene Peterson of Drain notched a series clincher over Bill Hanauska of Bandon.

Pete Lesmeister, who took in the series along with Whitey Matson, Frank Burdell, Jim Nierman and Keith Johnson, declared the series to be the best display of semi-pro ball it had ever been his privilege to witness. Outstanding plays were numerous and the fielding in most instances was of Coast league caliber.

Arlitt, Scrivens and Burdell are the only members of this all-star aggregation who have not had a fling of professional ball.
