NATIONAL FOREST TIMBER FOR SALE

Oral auction bids will be received by the regional forester or his authorized representative at the office of the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Grants Pass, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 P.M., PST, October 16, 1952, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 164 acres within Section 7, T. 40 S., R. 12 W., W.M. Nell Cr-Dry Cr drainages, Siskiyou National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 17,281,000 bd. ft., more or less, of Douglas-fir and 41,000 bd. ft., more or less, of Western hemlock and other species of sawtimber. No bid of less than \$15.50 per M bd. ft. for Douglas-fir and \$1.40 per M bd. ft. for Western hemlock and other species will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a cash bid, to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$0.15 per M bd. ft. to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, will be required.

As a qualification for oral bidding, all bidders must submit a sealed bid accompanied by the required payment to the forest supervisor prior to 2:00 P. M., PST, October 16, 1952. Sealed bids will be posted at the beginning of the auction for the information of all bidders. \$20,000 must accompany each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of sale. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the oral bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Forest Service bid forms for use in submitting sealed bids and full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the forest supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon, or the regional forester, Portland, Oregon, before bids are submitted. On September 26, 1952, at 10:00 A. M., forest officers will meet interested parties at State Forest Patrol Headquarters, Brookings, Oregon, to explain the conditions of the sale and to conduct a tour to show the timber offered for sale.
