New Washing Methods Easier Than Old



IN Colonial America, according to pictures left by our ancestors, one way of getting clothes clean was by stamping out the dirt. This may have been good clean fun on a hot day, but today's homemakers probably prefer to use a modern efficient washing machine and the new detergent that's blue.

The color of things has changed greatly since Colonial days. Wooden wash tubs of our forefathers have been replaced by mechanical washers — now a fixture in most American homes — and the more recent introduction of highly efficient detergents has added new cheer to blue Monday.

Milestones in modern soapmaking were the discovery of white

floating soap in 1879 and the more recent introduction of modern detergents which are unaffected by the natural minerals contained in water.

The latest development in the washday suds field is a blue, granulated product called Cheer. The exclusive formula of the product contains a scientific whitening agent which results in the whitest, brightest washes possible, it was pointed out by the makers. The new blue product is not a bluing, but is so effective that bluing is not needed unless especially desired, nor is bleach necessary except in the case of stubborn stains. The new product is also well suited for drain-dried dishwashing.

It is interesting to note that the hottest day of the season came on September 13 with a maximum temperature reading of 97.5 made at 10 p.m. Standard time. At one hour after noon the mercury was 86.0, and at the four o'clock observation the maximum thermometer registered 92.8.
