These men are always ready and willing to assist in matters of this kind; but information regarding it and the necessity for it, depends upon the people of Brookings-Harbor. Library Fund Is On The Increase

The members of the fund raising team and the officers of the Chetco Community Public Library Inc. would like to let us all know how we're doing as of now. Although the exact value of all assets are not available the present picture is one that is indeed encouraging. The amount of cash in the bank for the new building to house the library, which is presently operating from the V.F.W. Hall, is \$2042.79. An additional \$500. is pledged but not in yet. Added to this are pledges of materials and labor on the building to be donated amounting to well over \$1000.

The Federal Security Agency under The Health and Educational program are donating the land, appraised at \$1500. for the new library the deed to be deposited in a Title Co. for delivery to the Library Ass'n. when the building is completed, which must be within two years. These lots are 1, 2 and 3 of Block 29 at Brookings Guard Station. The building plans drawn by Roy Weideman, are being submitted to the Federal Security Agency so that they can draft a contract of sale, at 100% discount, for the lots.

At first the Federal Security Agency had stipulated that in releasing these lots to the Library Association, the requirements would be proof of financial responsibility to complete a building costing \$7500.00 on the site; but the Board have finally convinced them that with the donated labor and materials, a building satisfactory to them and to our needs could be built at less cost.

The Library Board figure that an additional \$2000.00, more or less, should be sufficient to complete the project.

Additional \$1000 in Sight

Report from one of the fund raising team says there is an additional \$1000.00 in sight. Mr. Morton of the Oregon State Bank suggested to her that if ten individuals would give \$100 each—he would be willing to head the list. She secured three more men who pledged their \$100 but ill health and pressure of personal business has halted her fine work

temporarily. We feel sure that there are six more individuals who will help speed this really worthy and needful cause. As most of you know, but some of our newer people may not. The Harbor Community Club started the library here some six years ago and have maintained it up to now, getting the courtesy of free housing where they might. However, with the continued growth of the community, they felt that the library should belong to and grow with the community, and this is what has been done.

The present set up until the next fiscal year—July 1953, when new officers and two new trustees

will be elected, are as follows. President, Erma Rice; vice-president, Mae Simpson; Secretary Myrtle Schaal; Treasury, Jessie Judkins. These officers, with the following five trustees form the Library Board. Trustees: Roy Brown, Max Brainard, Jack McCarten, Sylvia Knox and Frenchie Arrell. Mrs. Max Brainard, Librarian and Mrs. Sam Dotson, assistant librarian, serving without reimbursement.
