

### Curry Cattle Tested For Bangs Disease

Reports reaching the county agents office from the Bureau of Animal Industry, states that 45 herd of cattle in Curry County involving 463 herd of cattle were tested for tuberculosis infection without any reactors showing up. 48 herds involving 610 cows were tested for Brucellosis or Bangs disease. There were no reactors but 7 suspects according to Jenkins. These cattle tested involved both beef and dairy and were in the North end of Curry County, north of the Rogue River. This work being done by Dr. J. H. Bennett of Coos Bay. Testing work is the north end of Curry County is getting well under-way and will be completed within the next week or two, except for a few beef herds and isolated cases according to Dr. Lewis, veterinarian carrying on the testing work. Anyone whose cattle have not been tested should contact the County Extension office within the next week or two so that

these cattle may be tested during the current test. The testing work in the southern part of the county south of the Rogue River will get under way in December and January. This work will be done with Dr. Russ, of Grants Pass, with the Bureau of Animal Industry.

Bangs and TB testing is the control method for Brucellosis and Tuberculosis and is considered to be the partical method of control here in Curry County where we have a very low incidence of infection, according to Clifford Jenkins, County Extension Agent.

### Communism Topic Of V. F. W. Speaker

People who doubt the possibility of the West Coast ever becoming seriously effected by the Communist movement could well heed the topic of an address given yesterday by Dr. George C. Dunham, of Grants Pass, surgeon general of the Department of Oregon, Veterans of Foreign Wars. Dr. Dunham spoke at the meeting of the Sixth Oregon District, V.F.W., held at Gold Beach.

He is a retired major general of the medical corps, having had thirty-seven years service, much of it setting up public health systems in Central and South America.

The speaker stated that in this area there was a decided leaning toward communism, in one form or another, and a strong sentiment against the Americans and their system. He said we export from this area large quantities of timber to South and Central America and that there is more than a possibility that the Soviet could crowd us entirely out of this market, both for raw lumber and lumber products.

It is a well known fact that the stumpage of Eastern Siberia is almost unlimited and consists of the same trees on the shores opposite, in America, plus hardwoods of every eastern U.S. variety. They have huge sawmills in Vladivostok Bay and a big plywood plant was operating at Port Allen, above Vladivostok.

John Walker, of Shady Cove, department Americanism instructor, said that there was being prepared for submitting to the next Congress bills requiring Congressional approval of any

measures passed by the United Nations and also prohibiting the use of the words, "United Nations," unless in direct association with that body, citing in particular the UNESCO as being confused with the main body of the United Nations group. Walker said these bills were being prepared and would probably be presented under the auspices of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

E. L. Mikesell, Grants Pass attorney and head of the V.F.W. in Oregon, gave a stirring talk on the importance of membership.
