

Many Delegates Attend Oregon Fair Assn. Meet

The annual convention of the Oregon Fairs association held at Portland last week was attended by over 100 delegates from the thirty-six counties in Oregon. Reports made by county fairs over the state indicated last year's session was one of the best on record with exhibits, and attendance in most cases breaking all previous records.

The county fair boards reported the fairs were on a sound financial footing with very little red ink in evidence. This was largely credited to the assistance received from the state through pari-mutuel funds and the discontinuance of the federal amusement tax on general admission. Multnomah county fair manager, Duane Hennessy, however, reported that their fair was losing money and appealed for special help. The association referred this proposal to the individual fair boards throughout the state.

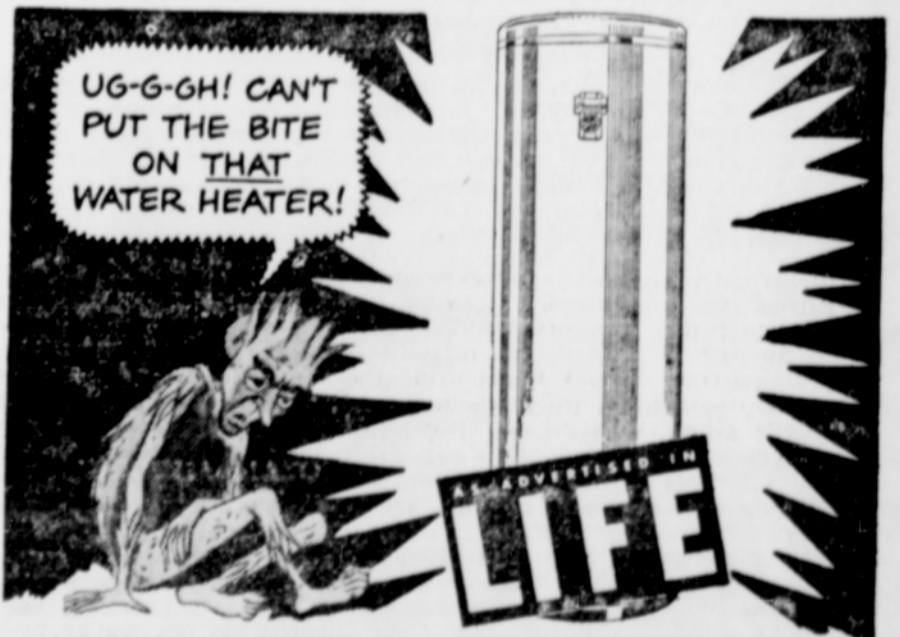
