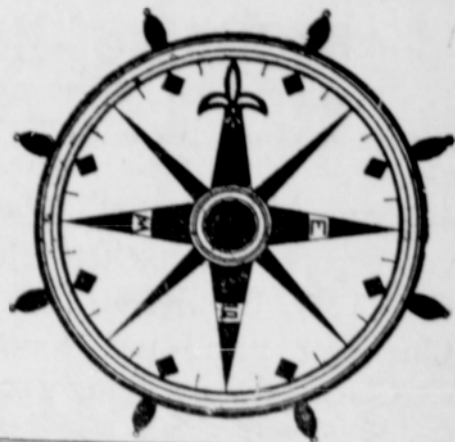

Thrift Inspires New Enterprise
