Thanks very much for your good letter of November 21, which arrived just as I was about to dictate a letter to you to express my great appreciation for the fine job you did in my behalf and the personal contribution you made toward my re-election to Congress. I am most grateful to you and only wish I might have an opportunity to see you and express my gratitude in person.

I am a subscriber to the Brookings Harbor-Pilot, but it is sent to my Washington, D.C., office. I do not believe I have yet seen a copy of the paper you refer to, so if you have an extra one available I would be very glad to have it here. I did note in the district tabulation, however, that Curry county turned in the highest percentage majority for me of any county in the district. Believe me, I am proud of that.

I had hoped I could visit Curry county again before returning to Washington but this will be impossible now. I am keeping in close touch with the Army Engineers regarding the Chetco Cove project. The preliminary survey report is now in the hands of the chief engineer with a recommendation that a full survey be made. If we can secure the approval of the chief, I feel rather confident that a survey made by the district engineer will develop a favorable report. I am following this matter closely and will endeavor to keep you informed regarding any progress made on it.
