**Obituary**

Services for John R. Hill, who died at his home in Springfield, Ore., Saturday, Dec. 6, were held at the Community Baptist church Thursday, Dec. 11, at 2:00 p.m., with the Rev. J. L. Mumbower officiating. Interment was at the William James Ward cemetery and was conducted by the Masonic lodge.

Mr. Hill was born Sept. 12, near Toronto, Canada. In 1892 at Olean, N. Y., he was married to Bertha A. Carmen, who died in 1939 in Harbor. In 1904 he and his wife came to Oregon and took up a homestead in what is now Carpenterville. He lived in Curry county until June of 1941, when he moved to Springfield to live with his daughter, Mrs. Florence Morrison.

He built many miles of the coast highway north of the California line and built and operated what is now Hanscam's store and the Chetco River autopark.

He was a member of the Port Orford Masonic lodge, the Curry chapter of Eastern Star, the Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce, and was a charter member of the Community church and Chetco grange.

He is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Florence Morrison, two sons, Harold W. of Harbor, and Frank W. of Brookings; five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
