Contrast Noted In Russian and Oregon Canned Food Output

Oregon's production of canned foods measured in terms of comparative population is 60 times greater than that of the Soviet Union, according to Dr. H. E. Michl, economist for American Can Company.

He said U. S. Department of Commerce figures show that the U.S.S.R. annually produces about 4.6 cans of food per person. Oregon's yearly production is equivalent to about 277 cans of food for every man, woman and child in the state, added Dr. Michl, whose company has pioneered in the development of high speed can production equipment which has made a large scale American canning industry possible.

Baby Clinic For Dec. 15 Scheduled At Local School

A baby clinic will be held at the Brookings Harbor school on Monday, Dec. 15, with local doctors in attendance.

Mrs. Harold Sargent is chairman and Mrs. Bertha Whirry will make appointments for mothers to have children examined. A small charge of 25c is made for the completed series of diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough shots—three in all; 25c for booster shots and 25c for the smallpox inoculations.

Oftentimes the beginning of an illness is discovered through these examinations and immediate steps taken to prevent serious complications. Corrections of physical tendencies in the early stages must be done for the welfare of the child, as all parents agree, and the doctors who give their time gratis to this work will discover all these things when they examine your child.

Contact Mrs. Bertha Whirry and make an appointment. Unless more families take advantage of this free service the clinic must be discontinued. Physicians' and nurses' time is valuable yet they offer this service free of charge to safeguard the health of children.
