### Employer Attackers Search Continues

By noon Wednesday Del Norte county officers had not found George Mourastoff who was accused of attacking Joe Sierka, owner of Castle Rock camp, December 9.

Mr. Sierka was released from Seaside hospital Thursday after receiving treatment for a lacerated arm. George Mouratoff, dockman, was reported crazed with drink when he attacked Mr. Sierka in his bedroom with a knife he had secured from the kitchen.

Sierka received several bad cuts, severed tendons and a vein which required a tourniquet by Mrs. Sierka before being rushed to the hospital where his wounds were dressed.

Because of the confusion authorities were not notified of the attack until late the next day. By that time Mouratoff had disappeared, leaving all his belongings behind.

With his arm in a sling, Mr. and Mrs. Sierka left Friday for a vacation to southern California to be gone until the first of the year.
