fair board member, will present the championship trophies won at the recent lamb and wool show. Rod McKenzie, president of the Curry County Livestock association has assured stockmen that he will start the meeting promptly at 10:00 a.m., so that the meeting can be completed by mid-afternoon and those who come early will have an opportunity

to see an interesting agricultural film.
