Yankowski's "Korean Christmas Carol."

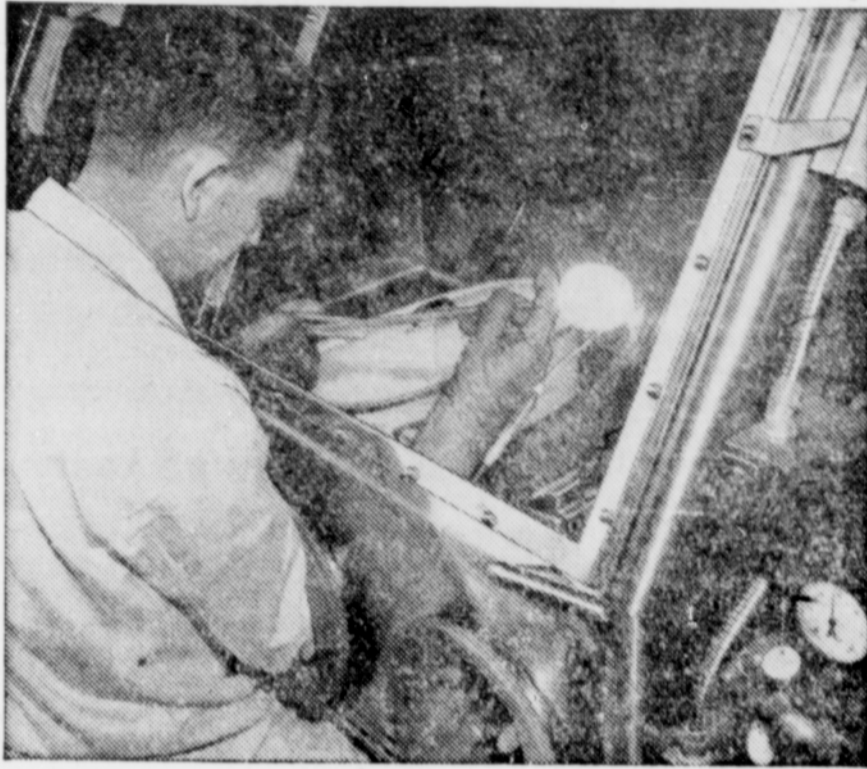
'Twas the night before Christmas
