George Widney, who has been ill at his home for the last two weeks, is up and about and feeling much better.

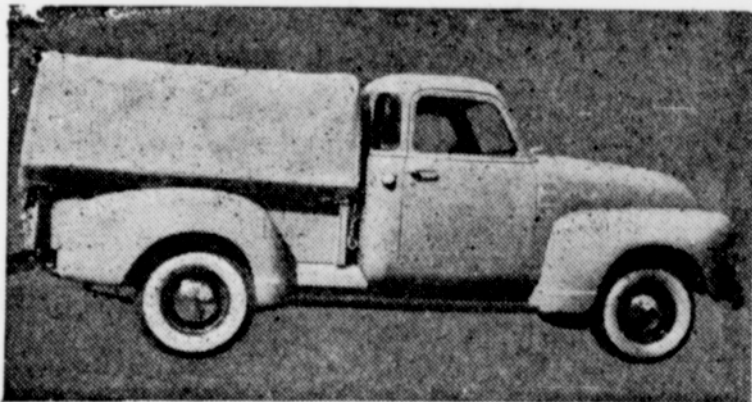
