

### Lions Organize In Brookings

A large group of business and professional men in the Brookings-Harbor area met at the Chetco Inn Saturday night, Jan. 10, and laid plans for a Lions Club. The Illinois Valley and Crescent City clubs jointly are sponsoring the Brookings club.

After a wonderful meal was served, District Governor Gunner Wohgan gave an interesting and historical narration on the Lions club and its activities. Directors: Rodrick Herman, 2-year term; Bert White, 2-year term; Earl Coates, 1-year term; Henry Huovila, 1-year term.

Meetings will be held at the Chetco Inn on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month. The next meeting will be Jan. 28.

Charter night was tentatively set for Feb. 14 but final plans are to be arranged by a special charter night committee.

There is expected to be a large crowd in Brookings from various clubs of the state for Charter Night. Arrangements are being made for 200 to three hundred guests. Entertainment will be provided along with the dinner meeting. Many of the visiting clubs will bring along some of their outstanding artists.
