Last Friday, Feb. 6, the Brookings Bruins traveled to Port Orford to play on the Pirates' home floor. The Bruins, at the end of first quarter, trailed by the score of 16-9. The second quarter proved better for the Bruins and the half-time score was a 24-24 deadlock. At the end of the third quarter the Bruins led by a score of 38-32. The fourth quarter was a good one for Brookings, ending 54-37 in favor of the Bruins. Boyd Western paced the Brookings scorers for the night with 17 points, followed closely by Jack Grush with 14. The Bruins lost Dennis Fadling, who in the final quarter fouled out. This victory for the Bruins made the tenth conference victory against no defeats. The individual scoring was as follows:
