Of the \$2,000 net return in Curry county, \$1,000 goes to the National Foundation of Infantile Paralysis. This money is used for research studies of the polio disease, and for aid to counties whose local funds are exhausted.

One thousand dollars goes to the Curry county chapter and a total of over \$3,000 is now available locally to pay needed and hospital expenses of anyone having polio in Curry county.

Last year on two polio cases in Port Orford, about \$500 in local funds was expended.

Mr. Porisch, Curry county chairman of March of Dimes, says he is highly pleased that Curry county, regardless of weather, road conditions, and unemployment, has again gone over the top for the March of Dimes.

The community chairmen and all helping in the campaign are to be commended.
