## Verna Mendenhall Heads County Easter Seal Sale

Mrs. Verna Mendenhall, of Brookings, Ore., has been named chairman of the annual Easter Seal Sale in Curry county, T.

Lawson McCall, president of the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults, which sponsors the sale, has announced.

The sale is held annually for a month-long period immediately preceding Easter Sunday, and the dates this year will be March 5 to April 5.

Assisting Mrs. Verna Mendenhall in Curry county will be the following persons: Mrs. Edith Fox, county mailing chairman, Brookings; C. J. Meyer, county treasurer, Gold Beach; Mrs. Patricia Helrig, publicity chairman, Brookings.

The task of preparing the Easter Seals for mailing to residents of Curry county has been under way for several weeks. The first seals will go into the mails on March 5, and Mrs. Mendenhall has urged the county's residents to respond as early as possible.

"The sale of Easter Seals provides the principal means of support for the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults," Mrs. Verna Mendenhall said. "And hundreds of physically handicapped Oregonians are counting on your purchase to help them."

Mrs. Mendenhall explained that the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults offers its services and facilities to those persons who cannot qualify for assistance from any other agency, either public or private.

The society operates the Children's Hospital School at Eugene, where crippled children from over 20 counties receive special education and training. It also operates the Craft Shop of the Handicapped in Portland, where articles made by handicapped persons are sold at retail.

Assistance is also provided for individuals needing medical surgery and for those requiring speech treatment.
