Mr. Foster further stated that the corporation had received permission from the Corporation Commissioner of the State of Oregon to sell its new issue of common class "B" capital stock, and that the sales for this stock are presently proceeding. Mr. Foster stated that the response to date on the sale of stock in the Brookings area has been encouraging, and it is hoped that the new issue will be fully subscribed in the near future. Mr. Foster stated that the corporation, through its board of directors, has decided that the new issue consisting of 100 shares will be limited to the sale of one-half of that issue or 50 shares. As soon as subscriptions for 50 shares have been secured the corporation will then terminate all further sales of the new stock.

Mr. Foster emphasized that the business outlook for the immediate future appeared to be very promising. The national plywood market recently took a second

price rise and the corporation is able to secure far more orders than it is presently able to manufacture and ship. In order to increase the production of the plant, the plant, effective March 1, 1953, went back on a 48-hour week and will remain on 48 hours for the foreseeable future.
