## Book On Africa Written Locally

Alexander Lake, Smith River, is more than pleased by the way in which his book, "Killers in Africa" is being received. Doubleday and Company stated that the book became a top seller the day after publication, which was March 5.

## MOLE AND GOPHER POISONING SEASON

This is the season when moles and gophers may be controlled with poison baits. Worms soaked over night in Mol-Kil or 1080 when dropped in the sub-surface run is a very effective control measure with moles. Sliced carrots treated with alkaloid strychnine in the gopher runways is equally as effective on gophers. Angle worms and not the manure type worms should be used. They should soak over night in the Mol-Kil and dropped in the runs the next morning. A little precaution now may protect your garden next summer.

## PURCHASE IRRIGATION EQUIPMENT NOW

Farmers planning to purchase sprinkler irrigation equipment for next summer's use, should do so now. Alum pipe is in good supply; dealers have ample time to do a good job of designing. If purchasing is put off till next spring, dealers will be rushed and it will be impossible for every-

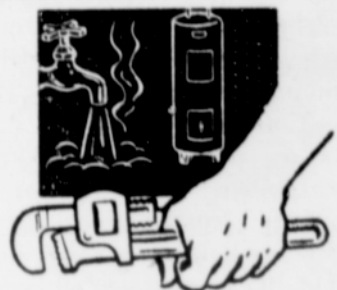
## Ave Maria Study Club Organized
