## Plant Roses In Unusual Places

There is nothing quite so  
charming as coming upon bloom-  
ing rose plants unexpectedly.  
With many vivid colors to select  
from, roses can add a burst of  
riotous color to the duller spot  
on the landscape.

Along walks, beside brick walls,  
grouped about the property, on  
fences and elsewhere roses add  
grace to living.

While some home gardeners  
prefer the flower perfection of  
the well-cared-for hybrid tea  
rose, for bursts of color around  
the property the floribunda rose  
is generally preferred, largely  
because of its clusters of blooms,  
according to the American Asso-  
ciation of Nurserymen. New  
ever-blooming climbing roses also  
offer a challenge to other forms.  
Rose hybridizers are constantly  
striving for newer, bigger, better  
and more colorful roses, and  
never a year goes by without in-  
troductions of startling beauty.  
And happily enough, though the  
plants are better and more pro-  
lific of blooms than ever, prices  
have not increased materially.

Roses will prosper in a variety  
of soils, from sandy to clay loam.

Spring Brings the Urge To  
Clean and Paint-up

To simplify mixing paint to  
match work already done, smear  
a little of the mixed paint on a  
piece of window glass. Then hold  
the glass against the surface to  
be matched and compare the col-  
ors. If the swatch doesn't match,  
wipe it from the glass before ap-  
plying another sample.

Planted so the soil barely covers  
crown, pruned back to a foot or  
so above the ground they will  
grow readily in any reasonably  
fertile soil. If mulched with peat  
moss they will do better. About  
the only thing roses don't like is  
continuously wet, low ground,  
and exceptionally windy locations.  
Feed with a good rose food and  
spray as often as required.

The popularity of rose plants  
is due largely to the success peo-  
ple have had growing them. Of  
course the rewards of large bou-  
quets of beautiful flowers is the  
biggest incentive to having them  
on your property.

The monochromatic color plan  
from head to toe is tops.

Colors for spring are still quite  
varied—in other words you may  
choose colors with the first

becomes you most.
