The aerial search being made by the Board of Aeronautics, headed by Oliver Norton, Medford for a light Piper craft which left Crescent City on Sat. morning for Kalispell, Montana, has met with no results at this writing.

On board were Mrs. Roy Wilhelm of Swan Lake, Montana, her two children, Leonard 2 and Katherine 7 weeks, and her brother, Forest Wright of Kalispell, Montana, pilot.

They had been visiting their sister, Mrs. Rita Tierce of Brookings the week previous, and their parents Mr. and Mrs. Scotty Wright of Crescent City.

The father phoned Kalispell at 9:30 on Saturday to ascertain if the plane had landed and learned that it had not arrived. Checking brought out the fact that it had not arrived at Redmond, Oregon and a search was begun of the area between there and the coast. Rain, fog and snow has hampered the search.

The husband of Mrs. Wilhelm arrived in Brookings on Tuesday to aid in the search by Army, Coast Guard and private planes.

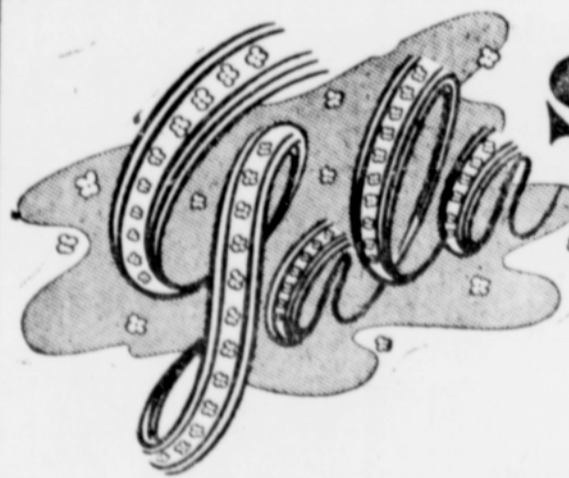
