The camp will accommodate something like 50,000 boys and will cost over three million dollars to set up. Each local boy will need approximately one hundred and seventy-five dollars.

Henry Kerr will act as commissary officer and will go down several days before the boys leave to see that food supplies are on hand and facilities for feeding the boys ready when they arrive.

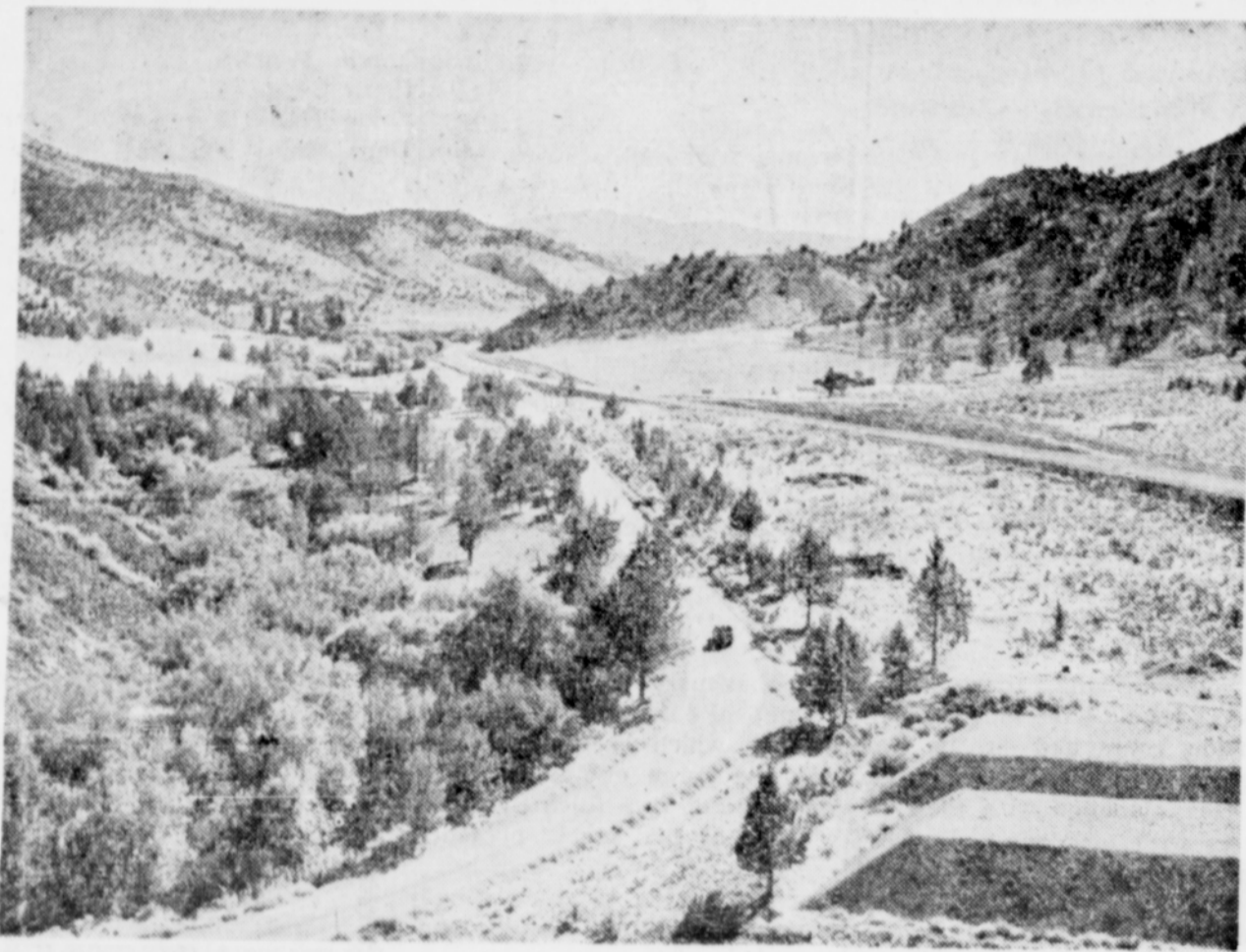
