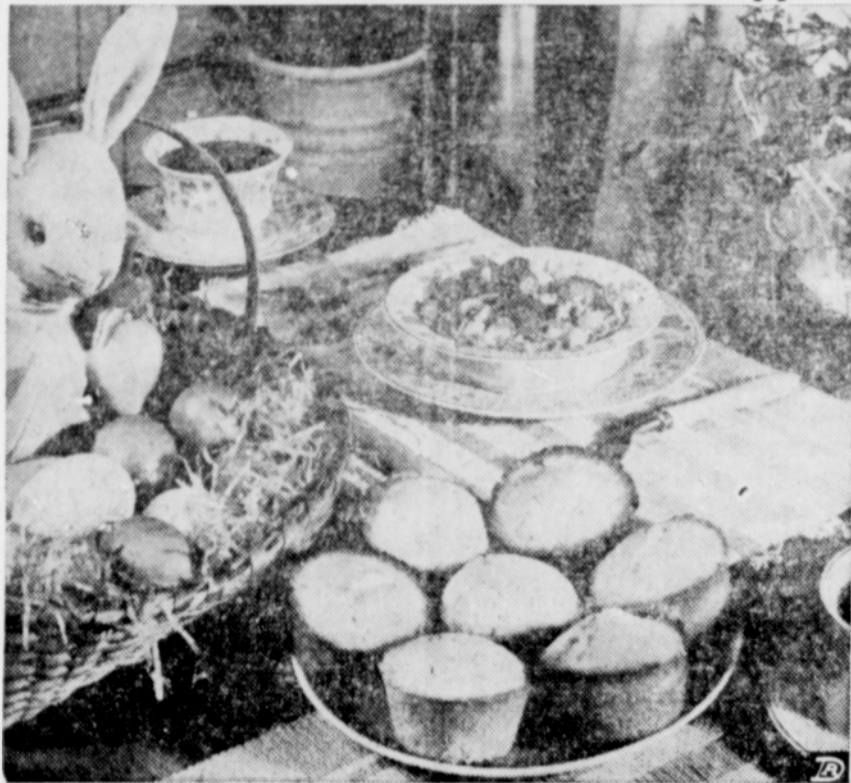
Dancing followed at the high school gym.

Corn Meal Bacon Muffins

- 1 cup sifted flour
- 3 teaspoons Calumet Baking Powder
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¾ cup yellow corn meal
- ½ cup shortening (part bacon fat)
- 4 to 6 slices crisp bacon, crumbled
- 1 egg, well beaten
- ¾ cup milk

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder, sugar, and salt, and sift again. Add corn meal and mix well. Cut in shortening. Add crumbled bacon. Combine egg and milk and add all at once to flour mixture. To mix, draw spoon from side of bowl toward center (15 strokes), turning bowl gradually. Chop spoon through batter (10 times). Then stir only enough to dampen flour (5 strokes). Turn into greased muffin pans, filling each about ¾ full. Bake in hot oven (400° F.) 25 minutes, or until done. Makes 10 large muffins.

Works of Da Vinci Displayed at OSC

The complete exhibit of the invention models of Leonardo da Vinci—the same one shown a year ago in New York's Metropolitan Museum in celebration of the 500th anniversary of Leonardo's birth—were displayed in the Oregon State college Memorial Union April 4 to 26.

The OSC appearance marks the first time the entire exhibit of this "prophet of modern science" has been displayed in the state.

Painter of the world-famous "Mona Lisa" and the "Last Supper," Leonardo is also renowned for his designs and inventions in the 1400's of many things accepted today as modern. Nearly five centuries ago, he conceived designs for the parachute, airplane, machine gun, printing press, military tank and air conditioning machine. Models of these, along with reproductions of many of his paintings, were included in the exhibit.
