May 8, 1953 — Four registered Jersey cows owned by Ralph E. Cope, Jr., Langlois, Ore., completed records on Herd Improvement Registry test during April which entitles them to special recognition from The American Jersey Cattle Club.

The high producing animal in the group was Poppy Eagle Noble Baby with a mature record of 12,250 lbs. milk containing 773 lbs. butterfat. The other cows all exceeded 650 lbs. butterfat on a twice-daily-milking, 305-day mature equivalent basis.

The official HIR tests were made under the supervision of the Oregon State College in cooperation with The American Jersey Cattle Club, national breed registry organization, Columbus, Ohio.

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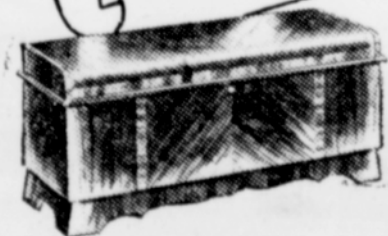

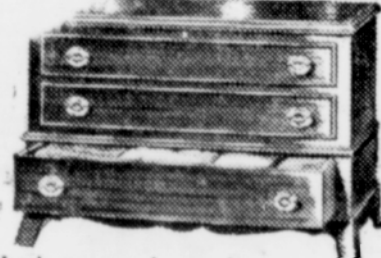
