

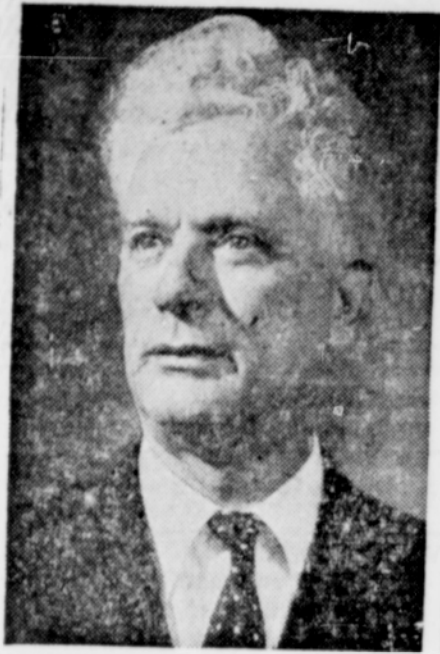

**Brookings Scouts
Jamboree Leaders**

Boy leaders for Jamboree Troop 24, composed of boys from Brookings, Coquille Valley and Mapleton, have been selected and given preliminary training. Senior patrol leader will be Dick Fadling, Brookings; quartermaster is Dick Berger, Brookings; scribe will be Gene Horn, Mapleton. Patrol leaders will be Philip Kessler and Bobby Dimmick of Brookings, and Gary Safley of Mapleton. Patrol leader for the Coquille Valley group is yet to be selected.

Scoutmasters will be Howard Greathouse of Brookings and Tom Greathouse of Mapleton, and the third scoutmaster is to be selected. Scout headquarters points out that there are still openings for additional boys, but Troop 24 has its full quota, and additional boys will be quartered with another troop in the Oregon Trail Council for the trip.

Preliminary training included camp layout and set-up, leadership instruction and troop discipline. They cooked meals from the jamboree menus and found the food good and plentiful. It is important that all Scouts come to the jamboree trained in cooking food in such a way that it can be served as a "family meal" to the patrol. toast, Jamboree mulligan, fried chicken, creamed chipped beef on toast, etc. A special training session for all Jamboree Scouts is planned for sometime in June, but any experience the Scouts can get at home with mother to help will be much appreciated by all the leaders.

JAMBOREE MULLIGAN

To Serve 10 Persons

- 2 1/2 lbs. ground beef
- 1 lb. onions
- 3 cans tomato soup (10 1/2 ounces)
- 1 lb. elbow macaroni

Peel onions and slice them up fine, put 2 tablespoons shortening in pot. When hot, fry onions in the shortening until light brown. Add the broken up ground beef, and fry, stirring occasionally. When meat is slightly browned, pour in the 3 cans of condensed tomato soup. Add 1 cup water, 1 level teaspoon sugar and 1/4 level teaspoon salt. Heat to simmering; simmer for 10 minutes.

Put on a separate pot of water, and when the water boils vigorously, add 1 teaspoon salt to it, then, while stirring, pour in the elbow macaroni gradually, so that the water does not stop boiling. Boil briskly for ten minutes, or until macaroni is tender. Do not overcook. Drain off the water. Add the thoroughly drained macaroni to the meat mixture.

This is probably one of the most difficult dishes on the menu, and each cook is cautioned to read the instructions twice. Each
