## Along Azalea Row With The Churches

On a recent stormy day a flock of Northern Phalaropes flew over our house bound for Arctic nesting grounds when one of their number died and fell on the dahlia bed in our garden. Son River; George G. Mateer, Tom brought it into the house, holding the soft little body tightly against his cheek.

The Phalaropes are one of the waders or shore birds. They are small birds seven or eight inches long. Their summer home is on the Arctic mainland. They swim with ease and are often found on open water, far out at sea.

In some ways the Phalaropes are different from almost all other birds. The female instead of the male wears the bright feathers and fine clothes just like us women do. The male is modestly colored and rather bashful. The female takes the initiative in courting and makes the first advances toward her prospective mate. When the eggs are laid, her husband never sees her again. The male incubates the eggs and raises the young while the female has a gay time all summer.

The little Phalarops which fell on the dahlia bed was buried in the garden by the children. They dug a grave and spread flowers over the burial place.

Two days later, the same little boy who had found the first phalarope came into the house carrying another bird.

"Where did you find this one," he was asked

"It's the same one," he said. "The wind blew the flowers off the grave, so I dug up the little bird to see if it was all right."
