

Many Events Take Place In Oregon This Summer

One of the most significant events during the month of June is the dedication of Detroit Dam on the North antiam river, June 10, by Secretary of Interior Douglas McKay. This is one of many interesting events and celebrations listed by the Highway Department Travel Division Schedule of Events for 1953 during the coming month.

Portland's Rose Festival will run from June 10-14, with the Grand Floral parade at 10:00 a.m., Friday, June 12, and the Junior Parade, 10:00 a.m., Saturday, June 13. Final event is the Golden Rose Ski tournament at Mt. Hood Sunday, June 14. The Salem Rose Society will hold its annual rose show in Salem, June 6-7.
