Ambulance drivers are needed if we are to continue having this service. Increased demands for moving the sick folks is putting a heavy strain on the present small crew. There were 62 runs last year, most of them to the hospital at Crescent City or Gold Beach. One driver made 47 runs. Do you realize how many hours that takes and how many road miles traveled?

In order to qualify: First you should be able to handle all types of cases with a level head; second, a good driver; third, a member of the association or one holding an advanced up-to-date First Aid card. If anyone is interested and having these qualifications who is able to donate his time at

a moments notice, please contact one of the association members ofr further information.

The new people in the community probably do not know the true story behind the non-profit volunteer group. Let us give you a few facts.

In March, 1948, this group incorporated and purchased an old ambulance with money procured by three organizations giving dances, the V.F.W. and the American Legion. Then two other organizations were invited in and they put up money to keep the running expenses and insurance paid. They were the Rotary and Rod and Gun Club. The old ambulance made 92 trips. Its condition was not the best after three years of use so the Rotary sponsored a drive by public contribution to raise a fund to purchase a new ambulance, which was bought in June of 1951. Strange as it seems it made 92 trips ending 1952, so you can see how the demand for its use has grown with the increase in population. The last three years the charges for services has paid all expenses.

Each year the income tax papers have been filed and the books are open for inspection to reliable people. Let it be clearly understood that never at any time has a driver received any wages for his time or services.
