EARTHWORK — GRADING  
CURBS AND DRAINAGE  
STRUCTURES**

Sealed bids will be received at the office of the City Clerk, City of Brookings, Oregon, until 8:00 p.m., P.S.T. June 23rd, 1953 and then and there be opened and read, for the construction of the following:

ITEM 1. The grading of the subgrade of Hillside Avenue from Chetco Avenue (Highway 101) to its intersection with Pacific Avenue from its intersection with Hillside Avenue to its intersection with Fern Avenue, a center line distance of 1135 feet. The total cut is estimated at 900 cubic yards of which 700 cubic yards will be placed in the street fills.

ITEM 2. Construct the following: Approximately 2200 lineal feet of Type C concrete curbs on Hillside Avenue and a portion of Pacific Avenue. Two concrete catch basins with grates. Furnish and install 78 lineal feet of 12-inch concrete pipe from catch basins and make connection to existing storm drain manhole at Hillside Avenue and Chetco Avenue.

Bids will be received for Items 1 and 2 separately or as a com-

bined bid.

Plans and specifications may be examined at the office of the City Building Official or at the office of the City Engineer during office hours.

Each bid shall be accompanied by certified check or Cashiers check or bid bond (with authorized surety company as surety) made payable to the City of Brookings in an amount of not less than 5% of the bid.

The City Council of the City of Brookings reserves the right to reject any and or all bids and to waive any informalities.
