

Elec. Co-Op Uses Radio System

Many of our residents are not aware of the fact that Coos Electric Co-op maintains an efficient communication system between its office and the crew on the job. This eliminates many trips for the workers and hastens the completion of all projects begun by them.

At the rear of the office, next to Pete Lesmeister's Real Estate office, a 78-ft. antenna picks up calls from the crew out on the job. Two trucks are equipped with mobile units and walkie-talkies can be carried by the men.

In installation and use it was found that some interference by minerals or other elements limited the spots where contact could be had with the Brookings office. Reception is good on the Wilbur Ostrander ranch. North of Carpenterville and also the Crook ranch through which the new highway will be located. From this relay station contact is made with the Gold Beach office.

The special custom job was made at Palo Alto to fill requirements of this locality. The local crew maintains lines from the California state line to Pistol River and co-ordinates with the Gold Beach office.

George Rush is manager of the local office and crew, which includes Russell Messer, Neil Nelson, Jr. Shrader, and Ricky Haggerty in the office.
