Oregon Early Days Under Study at OSC

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—New information about Oregon in the days of the Hudson's Bay company and of the reform movement in the state from 1890 to 1912 should come from two new research projects which Dr. Joseph W. Ellison, head of the history department at Oregon State college, is starting this summer.

In the first project, Ellison will explore the workings of the fur company under Dr. John McLoughlin, the early fur traders in the territory, coming of the missionaries and pioneers and the formation of the provisional government in Oregon. Ellison is hopeful that recently-released letters by Dr. McLoughlin will aid in the study.

The reform movement includes the development of the Oregon system of the initiative, referendum and recall, the Grange movement, Populist movement and woman suffrage. W. S. U'Ren, a colorful character in the early history of Oregon, was leader of the whole reform movement while Abigail Scott Duniway led the drive for woman suffrage, according to Ellison.

SHORTCAKE FANS ARE INDEBTED TO STATE'S CANNERS

Strawberry shortcake enthusiasts can thank Oregon canners for a major part in making the tasty dessert a year-round treat.

Last year, according to American Can company, the state's processors packed 52,870,000 pounds of Oregon-grown berries — 28 per cent of the nation's total processing tonnage.

Dr. Glenn Cunningham, economist for the can-making firm which developed new and more efficient containers to preserve the natural flavor of canned strawberries, pointed out that Oregon is No. 1 state in the production of strawberries for processing. The \$8,086,000 that Beaver State berry

growers received from processors in 1952 was the largest farm income derived from the sale of any individual truck crop.

"Canners and freezers now buy more than 96 per cent of the state's strawberries," Dr. Cunningham said. "The \$6,500,000 paid to Oregon agricultural workers for the planting, cultivating and harvesting of this crop in 1952 is an indication of the economic importance of the processing industry to Oregon."
