

Beavers Split With Studs

Brookings' Beavers celebrated Independence Day at Medford on July 5th by rallying in the top of the 9th for four runs on four hits to edge the Cheney Studs 8 to 6 and thus gained their second Southwestern league win. Manager Jim Lowman's double driving in two runs was the deciding blow. The Beavers slammed out a total of 15 hits off the offerings of Clarence Mellbye and Terry Maddox. Frank Burdell came out of his batting slump with four hits in five trips to the plate, Ritchie Price and Jim Lowman each had three hits and Jim Barrett and Jim Lowman each had a pair of singles.

Starting Beaver pitcher Jim Nierman hurled a fine ball for six innings but the Medford heat apparently weakened him and Corky Coleman came to his relief in the 7th and got credit for the victory.

The Studs defeated the Beavers 7 to 3 Saturday night with "old pro" Paul Gehrman holding the Brookings to three hits in seven frames, both singles by Jim Barrett, and then retiring in favor of Terry Maddox who allowed only a double to Price.

The Beavers draw a league "bye" this coming week-end but play Crescent City an exhibition tilt on the Merchants diamond Saturday afternoon at two o'clock (daylight time) and then another practice game against the Glen-

Tuesday, July 14, 1953 is the last day applications will be accepted by the U. S. Civil Service Commission for the postmaster position in Brookings, Oregon.

According to an announcement by the Commission in Washington, D. C., the number of applications received so far has not been sufficient for adequate competition. The current examination was announced under new qualifications standards recently agreed upon by the Post Office Department and the Civil Service Commission. Officials of both of these agencies hope that the new examinations will attract a larger number of well-qualified applicants than has been obtained in the past.

Application forms and further information on the examination are available in the post office at Brookings. The forms must be filed by the deadline with the Civil Service Commission in Washington, D. C.
