Henry Grimes, 50, of Smith River was killed instantly Saturday, when a limb from a tree fell on him while working in the logging woods for the Putman Logging company.

Mr. Grimes was born April 1, 1903 spent all his life in Del Norte county. Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon from Wier's Chapel in Crescent City,

with Rev. E. Thuembler officiating at the services.

Interment was in family plot in Indian cemetery at Smith River.

Surviving are his wife Georgia, a step father Will La Fountain and step mother Amelia Brown, four sisters Bernice Coughlin, Anna Sanderson, Harriet Brown, all of Smith River, a brother Joe La Fountain of Smith River, another sister Mrs. Bertha Stewart of Washington, D.C.
