SALMON ARE OFF MOUTH OF CHETCO; SOME CUT-THROATS IN

The fall run of salmon on the Chetco should begin soon, according to John Hewitt at Parker's Anchorage.

The forerunners of the salmon run have appeared off the mouth of the river, and there are large schools a mile or two offshore. Local boats have been making good catches, although rough weather has hurt the fishing.

With good weather, the salmon should start coming up the river soon, according to John. The river is open and ready to receive them.

Fair catches of sea-run cut-throat are also being made on the Chetco in recent days. Perch fishing at the mouth of the river is very good.

Farther upstream the fishing for rainbows is spotty, with a few good catches being reported.

On the Smith and Winchuck, a few salmon are in the river, but the big schools are still outside the mouth. A few salmon have been taken on the Smith, and at least one in the Winchuck.

Road Commission To Let Jobs

Bids for the purchase of \$32 million of state highway bonds will be received by the State Highway commission at its next regular meeting at 9 a.m., August 7, at the Imperial Hotel's Green Room. Procedure for advertising the bids for that date were made at a special meeting of the commission in Portland, Wednesday.

The new issue was authorized by the 1953 legislature, in addition to the \$40 million issue of the 1951 session and their revenue is intended with the addition of current funds available for construction, to complete the current major five year reconstruction program for the state highway system. The bonds are to be non-callable 13 year securities. They are to be retired at the rate of \$2 million each year for the first 7 years and at the rate of \$3 million annually during the succeeding 6 years.

The bond sale completed, it is the anticipation of the commission to call bids at its next monthly meeting, September 24-25, for construction projects estimated to cost approximately \$9 million; the commencement of the second phase of the reconstruction program.

Before adjourning the special meeting the commission set August 10 to 14, inclusive as the time for the final inspection trip of the year during which it will view at first hand the construction and reconstruction projects of the current year, as well as survey new construction to be projected during the coming two years. This trip, covering those

sections of Western, Southwestern, Southern and Central Oregon not yet visited, will complete an over-all survey of the extensive highway improvement work carried forward since the 1951 legislature granted its first \$40 million bond issue with which to commence modernizing the highway system of the state.
