Mrs. Mendenhall, who was chairman of the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults in this area for the year ending June 30, 1953 reports that Curry County donated 77.91 per cent increase over the previous year to this fund. This was \$668.06.

The county workers mailed 2871 seal letters. The grand total for the state was \$122,777.88. Howard Feast, executive director, commends county chairmen for their fine work in adding to this fund.

Local Man Fined For Dumping

Bud Haley of Brookings pleaded guilty last week in Justice of the Peace Court to dumping garbage on a public road.

Haley was fined forty dollars and costs by Judge Schaal, and sentenced to twenty days in jail. The jail sentence was suspended upon payment of the fine, and \$25 of the fine was suspended, contingent upon the cleaning up of the garbage.

Deputy Sheriff Wes Smith, who arrested Haley, emphasized that his office was making every effort to halt the dumping of garbage on public roads, which has been a major nuisance in this area.

OSC To Auction Sheep, Livestock

Registered beef and sheep from Oregon State college breeding stock will be auctioned August 20 at the OSC livestock pavilion, according to Dr. Fred F. McKenzie, head of the animal husbandry department. The auction begins at 1 p.m. Bids will also be accepted by mail.

Five dwarf-free, registered yearling Hereford bulls top the auction list. Dr. McKenzie says up to 100 per cent above average the bulls have made rates of gain—as high as 3 3/4 pounds gain per day.

Fifteen dwarf-free, registered Hereford cows and heifers have also been declared surplus to hold down the size of the breeding herd for genetic studies. Eleven of the animals are two-year-olds and yearlings, and two are dames of the herd's outstanding sires.

Seventeen registered yearling and two-year old Hampshire, Romney, and Southdown rams will be auctioned. All are out of good producing ewes and are by progeny-tested rams.

More than 125 commercial ewes—Hampshires, Border-Leicesters, Cheviots, and Romneys—ranging from three to seven years will be sold. All produced and weaned lambs in 1953.

Members Building Bible Church

The Brookings Bible Church being erected on North Hazel, between Del Norte Lane and Alder street on the Ocean View tract is going up rapidly.

Ed McClain, pastor, says that the church received their permit on a Wednesday and by Friday night the forms had been installed and the cement foundation poured.

Thirty-four members helped in hauling rocks and making forms. The next day 17 men poured cement, beginning at 5 a.m. and working until 6 p.m.

The studs are now up on the 72x32 recreation wing, which will be used for meetings until the main church is erected.

The congregation expects to hold meetings in the building in a very short time. On Sunday, August 9, an outdoor church service will be held at the building site at 11 a.m. In case of inclement weather services will be held as usual, above Fox Bros. terminal.
