was the stipulation that the city might, in the event of the applicant failing to do so, complete such work to the city's satisfaction, and charge the applicant for the work.

The right of appeal from the decision of the superintendent of streets to the city council is also included in the ordinance, as well as penalties for failure to comply.

Other action taken by the city council brought up a discussion of street conditions on Easy street. Residents from that area requested more adequate drainage of their street, as well as better surfacing, and they received a promise from City Superintendent of Streets O. D. Arp to survey the area and make recommendations for improvements.

The city also laid plans for paving work previously agreed to by the State Highway Commission on city streets. No bids were received on the call made last year by the state, and the commission has postponed the work until spring. The highway group has assured the council, however, that the funds have been set aside for the work.

In other action, the council approved the request of the Highway Market for a package beer license, and discussed traffic regulation down town.

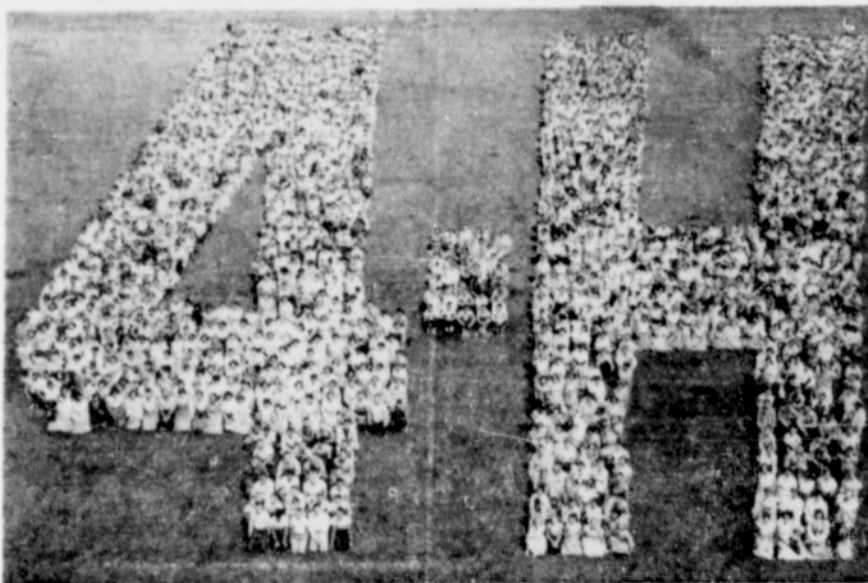
