### LEGAL NOTICE

ORDINANCE NO: 49  
AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SERVICE OF PUBLIC UTILITIES IN THE CITY OF BROOKINGS, OREGON; PROVIDING PENALTIES; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. The City of Brookings does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Every public utility producing, transmitting, delivering or furnishing water to the City of Brookings and the inhabitants thereof shall render service that is safe and adequate.

SECTION 2. Whenever the City Council of the City of Brookings determines that service is not safe and adequate, the City Council shall make an order directing the utility to provide service that is safe and adequate, describing in what respects the service provided is not safe and adequate and providing a reasonable time within which said utility shall provide safe and adequate service.

SECTION 3. A copy of such order of the said City Council, duly certified to be a true and correct copy thereof, and of the whole thereof, by the City Attorney, shall be served upon said utility.

SECTION 4. Every public utility shall comply with orders of the City Council made pursuant to Section 2 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. Each day of failure by said public utility to obey and comply with the provisions of such order, or orders, is a separate violation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. Each violation of this ordinance is punishable by a fine not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment and confinement in the City Jail for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days, or by both.

SECTION 7. This ordinance is adopted in order to preserve the public health and welfare pursuant to the power granted to cities and towns by Section 112-461, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, and the police power of the City of Brookings.

SECTION 8. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Brookings, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

### OSC Circular Gives Bulb Grader Plans

Plans and specifications for building a Croft lily bulb grader are found in a new Oregon State college circular of information.

The circular is the result of a joint project of the Agricultural Engineering Research Foundation and the Oregon agricultural experiment station through its department of agricultural engineering. The project was undertaken to develop a mechanical Croft lily bulb grader that would replace the slow and tedious hand process that has been used in the past.

Entitled "A Croft Lily Bulb Grader," the circular was prepared by J. B. Rodgers, head of the agricultural engineering department. Copies are available from county extension offices and from the bulletin clerk at Oregon State college.

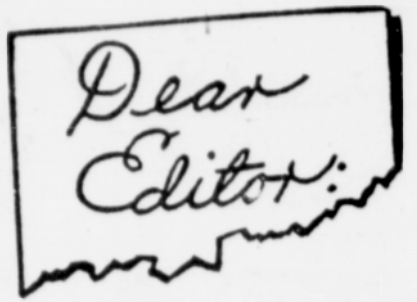
