### HELEN CHADWICK'S SISTER HERE

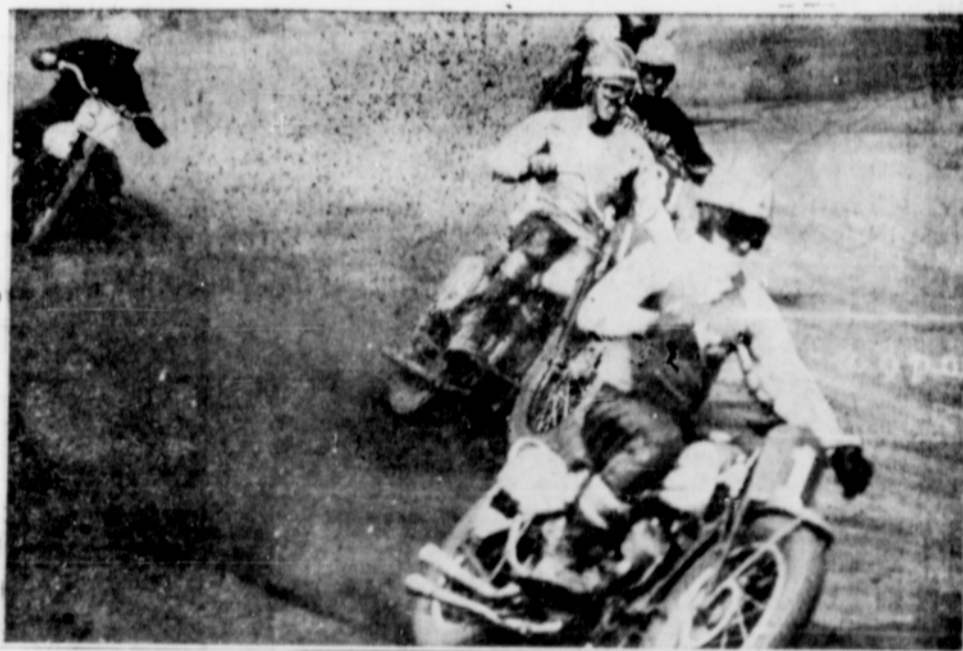
