This mark will be placed across the grain at the end of each piece of lumber of grade and quality approved by the owners for marketing under this trademark.

And by reason of priority of adoption of the Trademark herein described, the South Coast Lumber Co. hereby claims the right to the sole and exclusive use of the same within the State of Oregon for the purposes herein stated.

Portland office of the game commission before 10 a.m. September 22. Drawings will be held on September 24 at 10 a.m. and permits and maps of the areas will be mailed to the lucky winners the following day.

Parties of not more than four persons may apply as a unit, provided that each member of the party signs the application; however, members of the party cannot submit individual applications and persons doing so will be barred from participation in the season.

The single controlled season on deer is in the Adair tract just north of Corvallis and 300 permits will be issued for hunters to take one deer with at least a forked antler. An unused general tag is required in addition to the special permit.

Four hundred additional permits are to be issued for controlled elk seasons being held in the Tillamook and Indian creek areas.

From November 21 to 23, 200 hunters will be permitted to pursue bull elk with at least three points in the Tillamook area located just north of the Wilson river highway.

Elk of either sex will be legal in the Indian creek controlled hunt area which is north of the middle fork of the John Day river and east of Highway 395. This season will extend from December 5 to 9.

Hunters in the two elk areas will be required to have an unused general elk tag plus the special free permit.

There will be no special fees for any of the seasons, but applicants are warned that applications not properly filled out will be rejected. Applications may be made for one area only and must be on official game commission forms.
