

Lois Swanberg Passes Aug. 31

Lois Angeline Swanberg, wife of Adolph Swanberg, passed away in Salem Monday, August 31, 1953.

Mrs. Swanberg had been in ill health for the last two years. She was removed from a hospital in Eureka to Gold Beach and from there to Salem, where she passed away shortly after being admitted.

Lois Angeline Jones was born at Vancouver, Washington in 1875 and married Adolph Swanberg, in 1918. They came here from Lake of Woods in 1928 and 29 to fish and in 1943 decided to make Brookings their home. Mrs. Swanberg enjoyed her home here which overlooked the ocean.

During her serious illness, old friends, Mr. and Mrs. George Boussum, San Diego, were called. Mrs. Boussum came to help with the care of Mrs. Swanberg and remained with her until she succumbed.

Cremation services were held in Salem.

Mr. Swanberg plans to sell his property here and make his home with Mr. and Mrs. Boussum. They do commercial fishing out of San Diego but will build a home at Morro Bay later in the year.
