

## Right Turn OK On Red Light

You can make a right turn against a red light after stopping, the secretary of state's traffic safety division reminded Oregon motorists this week.

The division said many drivers still are failing to take advantage of the law permitting such turns even though it has been in effect for well over two years. Making the turn, the division pointed out, helps ease congestion and traffic tie-ups in downtown areas.

Left turns into a one-way street in which the direction of travel is to the left also are legal, even though a red light is still showing. In both cases, a right-of-way stop must be made first, the right-of-way yielded to any pedestrians in the crosswalk, and the turn completed only when the intersection is clear of other traffic.

## Community Club of Harbor to Give Gifts to Camp White Vets

Members of the Harbor Community Club were guests of Mrs. Nellie Jagers and Mrs. Bess Miller at the home of Mrs. Jagers last Friday for their regular monthly meeting.

The president, Mrs. Lea Morgan, had some difficulty in calling us to order because of competition by the wonderful view from the Jagers' hillside home. It took several minutes for everyone to exclaim and then try to identify all the roof tops, homes and gardens which could be seen. I think some of the ladies were even trying to identify the auto-passing over the Chetco bridge, even though they were mere toys seen from that distance.

The club voted to furnish as many of these items as possible. Each member is to make wool squares nine or twelve inches in width, finished off with a yarn button-hole stitch. These squares will then be assembled into the desired lap robes. (An excellent use for wool scraps and odd bits of yarn.) Feed sacks or remnants of bright prints will be made into the curtains and scarfs.

The secretary also reported that the Red Cross is in need of layettes. The club also voted to help with this. If the Red Cross will furnish the materials or the patterns for the desired articles the ladies will do the sewing.

There was a report on the wheel chair which the club owns and lends to anyone requiring it. The chair has traveled across the mountain and is being used by a veteran in Rogue River who was formerly a resident here.

Mrs. Martha Harbin was a guest of the club and gave a short talk about Azalea House at Oregon State college in Corvallis. Azalea House is a dormitory for girl students who are working their way through the college and

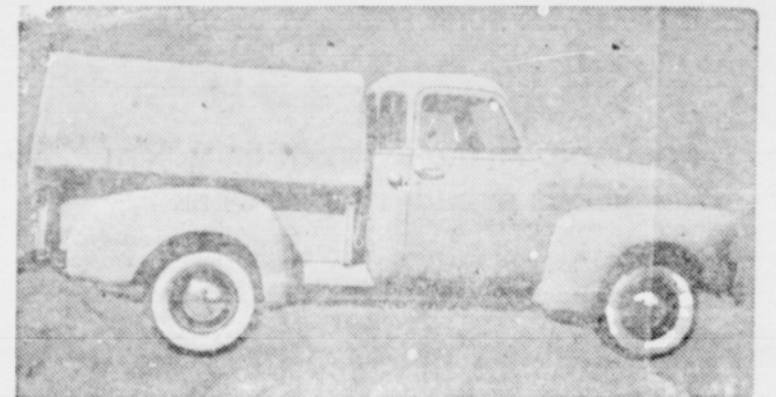
eling a la trailer since Mr. Wambsey decided to retire about a year ago. Fishing is holding their interest at the moment.
