Hunting Laws For Kids Given

With more youngsters becoming interested in hunting each year, the Oregon State Game commission has directed the following information to nimrods under 18 years of age. Hunters over 18 years of age must have a regular adult license, but those under this age may be able to get a less expensive license depending on the type of game they seek.

Juvenile hunters, those between 14 and 18 years of age, may obtain a special juvenile license for a fee of two dollars. This permits them to hunt upland game birds and waterfowl. Also with this "cut-rate" license, such hunters may hunt all types of predators and unprotected species. Children under 14 years of age do not need a license to hunt upland game and waterfowl but must be accompanied by a parent or guardian when hunting on other than their own lands.

In order to hunt big game, a regular adult license is required of all hunters regardless of age since deer and elk tags are issued only to holders of regular licenses. The price of the juvenile license cannot be applied to the price of an adult license if both are purchased the same year.

Federal regulations specify that any person 16 years of age and over must have a migratory bird hunting stamp in possession when hunting waterfowl.

Holders of juvenile licenses may participate in a special pheasant hunt held each year at the E. E. Wilson Game Management area just north of Corvallis.

Permits for this hunt are obtainable from the Portland office of the game commission.

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
