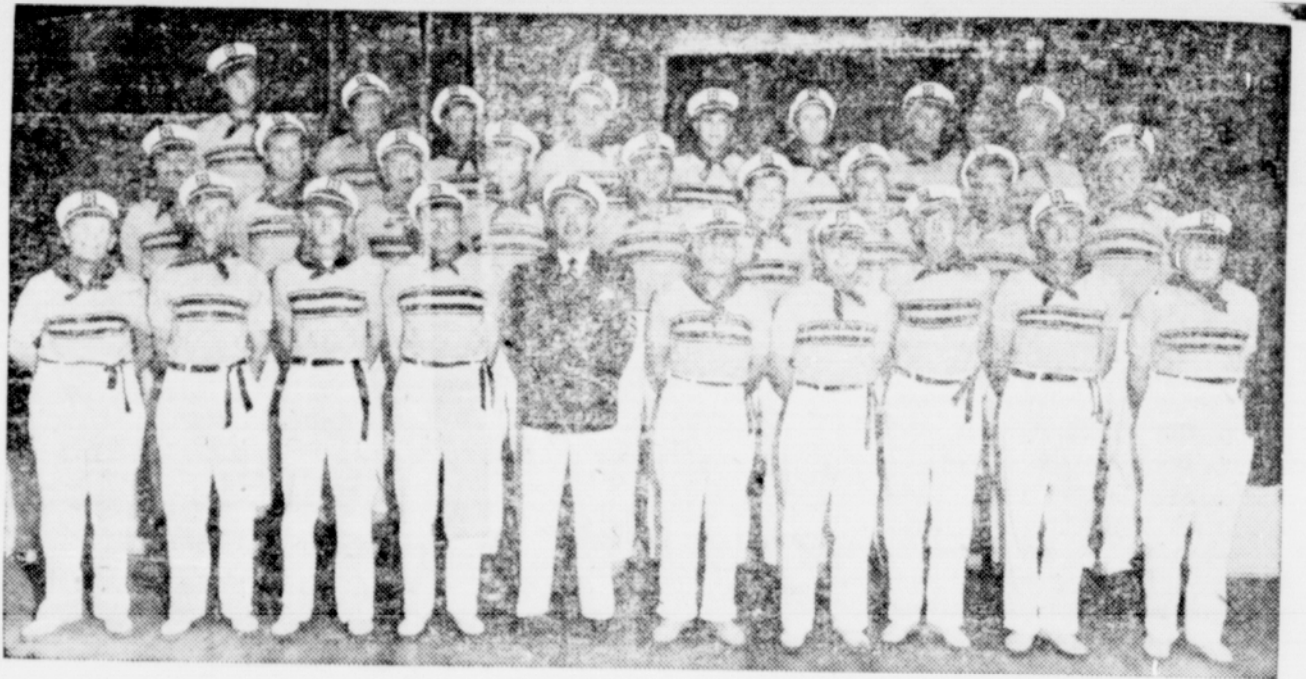
On September 13, 1953 the Brookings chapter sponsored a
